For Parents During Pride Month

"Pride Month has made me thoughtful about a parent's role in pride for their LGBTQ child. If pride is the opposite of shame, there are things we can do throughout the life of our child to show pride — regardless of their age or stage. Something we may fail to think about is the pride of the ordinary. Often parents still working to find their balance let everything focus on their child's identity and the problems the child may face or the parent's own fears for their future. Instead, when we talk about our child, we can focus on all the things we have known and loved for years." Read more here

Transgender Visibility

Fatal Violence Against the Transgender and Gender Non-Conforming Community in 2021

At least 8 more deaths have been recorded in May. "As HRC continues to work toward justice and equality for transgender and gender non-conforming people, we mourn those lost in 2021." Read more here

Dismantling a Culture of Violence

"It's not enough to grieve the loss of victims of anti-transgender violence. We must honor their memories with action. In this resource, we hope to demonstrate how anti-transgender stigma, denial of opportunity and increased risk factors compound to create a culture of violence. But most importantly, we provide clear ways that each of us, no matter who we are, can directly make an impact to make our society a safer place for transgender people." Read more here

Why Public Support for Trans Rights Will Grow

Policies expanding rights for transgender people probably will become increasingly popular. And the reason is simple. Public understanding of transgender policies will increasingly be informed not by news reports or political rhetoric, but through personal interactions with the people immediately affected by them. Previous research has consistently shown that views about same-sex marriage and homosexuality are strongly influenced by personal connections to gay and lesbian people. The same process will likely transform public opinion on transgender rights. Read more here

Who Must Transition? By Adam Briggle

"Dr. Diane Ehrensaft [director of mental health of the Child and Adolescent Gender Center at UCSF and author of a 2017 literature review of gender-affirming practices for trans youth] noted that past research focused on what was wrong with transgender kids. 'It looks like the pathology lies in the culture, not inside the child.' The research has a simple message: when trans children receive support affirming their identities, their mental health improves."

"Amber and I [parents of Max, trans 13-year-old] put it this way: we were the ones to transition, not Max. He already knew who he was. We had love but lacked comprehension; we could not encompass or include his way of being, because we had never seen—or had never recognized—an example of it before...

"We are all in transition...It can be disorienting. Like many, Perry [author of SB 1646, the bill that would classify parents as child abusers] is frightened and confused. Kierkegaard would tell him that he has a choice. We all have a choice...How to react? Do we close in, box out, and hold tight to our truths with righteous certainty? Or do we take a leap, open our hearts, listen to the people who are struggling to carry their existence, and help?" Read more here

HHS Says Prohibition on Sex Discrimination Includes Discrimination on the Basis of Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity

"The Supreme Court has made clear that people have a right not to be discriminated against on the basis of sex and receive equal treatment under the law, no matter their gender identity or sexual orientation. On May 10, HHS said it will act on related reports of discrimination," said HHS Secretary Becerra. Read more here

USA 6th Anniversary, Marriage Equality!



"If you had told me 20 years ago that today same-sex marriage would be a reality in 29 countries, I would not have believed you," said Jessica Stern, executive director of the global LGBTQ-rights group OutRight Action International. But she noted how polarized the world is regarding LGBTQ acceptance, with nearly 70 countries continuing to criminalize same-sex relations. "The progress has been great, no doubt. But we have a long road ahead," Stern said. Read more here

Evangelical Lutherans Elect First Trans Bishop

Megan Rohrer, who was raised Lutheran in South Dakota, talked about one way we might see more openly queer people involved in faith and faith positions. For example, Rohrer said their grandmother, who still lives in South Dakota, talked about how proud she was to have an openly trans pastor as a grandchild while at women's church gatherings. From there, Rohrer told the outlet, "people there would then feel like they could talk out loud about the queerness of their own children and kids." Rohrer said they think as "more friends and families are able to speak out loud about the trans people that they love, our world will begin to be a place that is more welcoming." Read more here

COVID-19 Vaccines and LGBTQ+ Community

From a Harvard PhD: "I have a confession: in late 2020, when the first COVID19 vaccines were approved by the FDA, I was hesitant to get one myself. Despite working in public health and believing strongly in vaccines to keep our community healthy, I was anxious about putting something in my body that seemed so new. I thought: 'What if the vaccine is dangerous? What about side effects?' I am part of the LGBTQ+ community. Our history may explain why I hesitated." Read more here

Out ABC News medical contributor Dr. Darien Sutton provides some insight about the future of the vaccine. He said, "I'm wondering if many of us have friends, relatives or even partners who are hesitant to get the vaccine, and when confronted with that uncertainty, are we left trying to figure out how to provide the right response?" LGBTQ Fear Invisibility in Covid19 Vaccine Data

Studies show that even though some people are hesitant to reveal such data, clinicians overestimate how many patients refuse to report themselves. A 2017 study Approximately 80% of clinicians believed that patients hesitated to provide this data, but revealed that only 10% of patients reported refusing to do so. Read more here

Hesitant to Get COVID19 Vaccine?

Overcoming vaccine hesitancy is a long, arduous task. It starts with not belittling people's reasons for holding off on getting the shot...The biggest benefit from the vaccine is that your odds of getting really sick, let along dying, from the virus plummet. Also, "getting a vaccine would get you out of some really questionable company. Among the biggest group of vaccine resisters are conservative white evangelicals. Many of the same leaders in that same group are attacking LGBTQ rights, and are also funding anti-vax efforts." Read more here

The Brits take their "mission of being here if you need us very seriously," and say they "will continue to be there to support every single LGBT person who needs us during the pandemic. For the safety of our communities, we have temporarily shifted to become a remote service delivery charity."
