#### HRC LGBTQ Equality Index

The Human Rights Campaign (HRC) Foundation, the educational arm of the nation's largest lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer (LGBTQ+) civil rights organization, in partnership with The Equality Federation, released its 10<sup>th</sup> annual Metropolitan Equality Index (MEI), the nation's only nationwide assessment of LGBTQ+ equality regarding municipal policies, laws and services. This year, a record-breaking 110 cities earned the highest score of 100, which is up from 11 in 2012, the MEI's inaugural year, illustrating the striking advancements municipalities have made over the past 10 years. The ACLU says, LGBTQ "people in America continue to face discrimination in their daily lives. While more states every year work to pass laws to protect LGBTQ ... we continue to see state legislatures advancing bills that target transgender people, limit local protections, and allow use of religion to discriminate." <u>Read more here</u>

#### 2021 Deadliest Year for Trans? YES!

On Nov. 9, 2021, with news of the killing of Marquiisha Lawrence in Greenville, SC, the Human Rights Campaign Foundation, the educational arm of the nation's largest lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer civil rights organization, has now officially recorded more violent deaths of transgender and gender non-conforming people than any year prior. <u>Read more here</u>

It's not enough to grieve the loss of victims of anti-transgender violence. We must honor their memories with action. In this resource, HRC hopes to demonstrate how anti-transgender stigma, denial of opportunity and increased risk factors compound to create a culture of violence. #### **HRC Annual Report on Violence Against Trans**

On November 20, the Human Rights Campaign Foundation released <u>"An Epidemic of Violence: Fatal</u> <u>Violence Against Transgender and Gender Non-</u> <u>Conforming People in the United States in 2021</u>" a report honoring the at least 46 transgender and gender non-conforming people killed in 2021 as of today and shining a light on data that HRC has continued to collect on the epidemic of violence.

With 46 known deaths since January 1, HRC has officially recorded more violent deaths of transgender and gender non-conforming people than any year since we began tracking this violence in 2013. Previously, the highest known number of fatal deaths of transgender and gender non-conforming people was in 2020, when we reported 44 people were violently killed throughout the calendar year. This year's report's release comes several days ahead of Transgender Day of Remembrance, a moment to remember the transgender and gender non-conforming people who have been lost to fatal violence over the course of the year. <u>Read more here</u>


