2023 Anti-LGBTQ+ State Legislative Activity

The weaponization of public policy has been driven by extremist groups that have a long history in working to oppress the existence and rights of LGBTQ+ people. Several of these organizations have been deemed hate groups by the Southern Poverty Law Center, such as the <u>Alliance Defending Freedom</u> and the <u>Family Research</u> <u>Council. Minnesota Lege Bans Conversion Therapy

We give thanks to the Minnesota State Legislature and the work of OutFront Minnesota for passing H.F. 16, which would ban conversion therapy practices in the state. This bill is an example of how pro-equality state legislatures are able to advance LGBTQ+ rights, even as other states are continuing to roll back critical rights and protections. <u>Read more here.</u>

"Clobber Passages" in Context

Aspects of context are important for our understanding of biblical passages, especially the ones often referred to as the "clobber passages." These are passages often interpreted to condemn same-sex relationships and LGBTQ+ people. Translating ancient languages is not a mechanical exercise as though there is a correct English equivalent for every ancient word. <u>Read more here</u>

The social world in which a biblical passage was written makes a difference for understanding its meaning. Interpreters can bring their own assumptions to biblical passages in ways that can distort the meaning. Such interpretations can make a passage seem to be about issues of homosexuality when it is really addressing something else. <u>Read more here</u>

Biblical passages usually cited against same-sex relationships are not uniformly clear. Translation and social-historical context are key factors in trying to make sense of them. Read more here

Int'I Day Against Homo-, Trans-, & Bi-phobia

The statement "All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights," appears in Article 1 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, and though the United Nations General Assembly proclaimed the document as a "common standard of achievements for all peoples and all nations" in 1948, it wasn't until 1990 that homosexuality was declassified as a mental disorder by the World Health Organization. (It did so on 17 May, hence the date of the observance.) <u>Read more here</u>

Recently, the National LGBTQ Task Force, the country's oldest LGBTQ advocacy organization, began a new podcast series in honor of their 50th anniversary. *Movement Moments: The National LGBTQ Task Force at 50* will span 6 episodes and focus discussion on topical issues facing the LGBTQ community today, including attacks on the trans community and the role of faith in movement while also reflecting on key moments in Task Force history. <u>Read more here</u>
