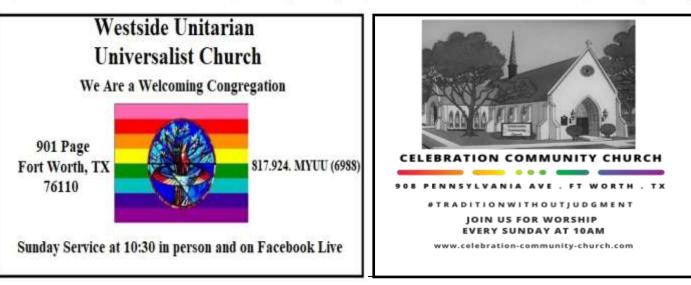

Emily Pesce, a trans woman and LGBTQ+ activist, who is Joon's CEO, says that Joon's "vision is to create a new model for mental health care, designed specifically for youth and young adults, that integrates the benefits of one-onone therapy sessions with a mobile app-based experience." Joon's mission is to overcome barriers to mental health care by making

quality care accessible to more youth and families

Emily transitioned when she was 38-years-old and was helped a great deal by therapy before, during, and since then. Her mission is to provide easy access to therapy for youth that need it, especially LGBTQ+ youth and those who are marginalized. Emily feels strongly that it is vitally important for LGBTQ+ to share their stories for visibility, community and to oon show how they are thriving in life.

approach for each client and provide tele-therapy that's fits into anyone's busy schedule. Joon's student advisory board provides feedback that helps Joon provide an engaging and enjoyable therapy experience for clients.

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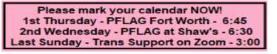
